

Benchmarking Practice

For further benchmarking practice, benchmark the resources on each of the websites listed below.

Be sure to watch the "How to Benchmark Materials" video before working through these websites.

Please remember that most existing adult literacy materials are not referenced to the Alberta Reading Benchmarks. So as you are benchmarking, if three categories out of four are in one benchmark that might be as good as it gets. For example, you might find a resource that has organizing features, vocabulary and visuals at level 1C but has sentence structure at 2A. You would benchmark that at level 1C.

Print off one **ARB Chart for Benchmarking Materials** for each resource listed below and see if it helps organize your thinking. After you've made your best educated guess, look through the **Starter List of ARB Benchmarked Materials** for the answers. Remember, even though a resource is benchmarked at a certain level, it can be used at other levels, depending upon the tasks you ask the learner to perform.
